




It's the star of dessert menus around the world and tops culinary bucket lists for visitors to the Florida Keys, but what's so great about Key lime pie? And who really serves the best slice?

Citrus pie may sound unappealing if you've never tried a slice, but one bite of real Key lime pie prepared fresh in the Florida Keys will have you hooked on our native dessert for life.

The filling only requires two simple ingredients; sweetened condensed milk and Key limes. Most recipes include eggs for color and texture, and the pie is completed with a crust and topping of choice.

Key limes are about the size of golf balls. They are more flavorful than the Persian limes you usually see in grocery stores and turn yellow on the tree when ripe. The limes originated in Southeast Asia but traveled the globe and paid a visit to Florida in the early 1800s. The limes who traveled north didn't survive the cold, but the ones who went south were in paradise. The climate of the Florida Keys was ideal for the citrus, and The Keys became the only place in the United States of America where the limes thrived. Valued for their flavor and nutritional attributes, they rapidly became a staple for local

seafarers. But to graduate to pie status, the tart juice of the limes needed some sweetness, and that's where a New York inventor named Gail Borden took center stage.

Gail Borden invented the Lazy Susan. He spent some time as a newspaper editor in Texas and is credited with coining the phrase "Remember the Alamo," but his most significant contributions to the world revolve around dairy. In 1856, Borden patented a technique he developed to condense cow's milk. Before modern refrigeration, if you didn't want to get sick or die drinking milk, you had to live near a cow. Borden saw several children die from malnutrition on a trans-Atlantic voyage. He decided he would do something about it, and got to work.

Borden's condensed milk was preserved with sugar and became hugely popular for its flavor and nutritional value during the American Civil War. After the war, sweetened condensed milk became a staple of the seafaring community, and a beautiful collision occurred in the waters off of Key West when an unknown sponge fisherman decided to mix his vitamin-rich Key lime rations with his nutritious condensed milk and the earliest version of Key lime pie was born.

The sponge fishermen were known as "hookers" because of the long poles they used to harvest sea sponges. They spent days at a time on the water and stocked their boats with supplies that included bread, Key limes, condensed milk, and coffee. But the bread had a short shelf life, so as it went stale, the hookers crumbled it into their coffee cups, softened it with condensed milk, added a wild bird or a turtle egg, and squeezed lime juice on top as you would for ceviche. After a quick stir, they ate it straight from the cup. It was delicious and nutritious, but the hookers weren't submitting recipes to the local paper, and their blue-collar dessert had some evolving to do.

Newspapers credit Aunt Sally with creating the first Key lime pie. They say it happened in the kitchen of William Curry, Florida's first millionaire. Though Sally's identity remained a mystery for more than a century, Aunt Sally is now thought to be Sarah Jane Lowe Curry. Her husband worked at a ship supply store that catered to sponge fishermen, and they lived next door to his millionaire dad. Sarah was "Aunt Sally" to 14 of William Curry's grandchildren, and it is suspected she started a buzz

around town when she served the blue-collar hooker dessert to neighborhood kids as a fast and simple-to-prepare treat.

Keys residents love gossiping, and the Currys were high on the social ladder. Local ladies looking to keep up with the Currys would have mirrored Aunt Sally's recipes and tried to raise the bar. This was when fancy crusts and toppings were added to the mix, and before long Key lime pie was a staple in Conch kitchens across the island.

Today, people argue about which crust and topping contribute to a real Key lime pie, but the truth is that people think the right way is how the pie was first served to them. For natives of the Florida Keys, this usually means a pastry crust and meringue topping. For visitors, this usually means a Graham cracker crust and whipped cream topping. Pastry crust and meringue certainly came first. However, Graham crackers and whipped cream became the standard once the Overseas Highway opened to automobiles because they held up better in restaurants catering to tourists than pastry crusts and meringue.

The evolution of Key lime pie continues today, with hundreds of variations on the classic delivered from innovative chefs up and down the island chain of the Florida Keys. No two pies are alike, and each is delicious in its own right.

Most every establishment will claim they have the best Key lime pie around, but where can you really get the best slice of Key lime pie in the Florida Keys? Key West culinarian Tim Watson said it best, "The best slice of Key lime pie 100% of the time is the one you are about to eat."

It's a Florida Keys experience you won't want to miss.

David L. Sloan is an American author and producer in Key West, Florida. He started researching the origins of Key lime pie in 1996 and authored the popular Key West Key Lime Pie Cookbook and Key Lime Pie: The Intriguing History of Key West's Native Dessert.

Sloan co-founded the Key Lime Festival in 2014, holds a record for the largest Key lime pie in the world, and was part of a team that successfully lobbied to make Key lime pie the Official Dessert of Key West and the Florida Keys.

He has appeared as a Key lime pie expert on Good Morning America, CBS Sunday Morning, Southern Living, The Telegraph, NPR, and Gordon Ramsay's Uncharted. Sloan competed in the Food Network's Food Challenge and was a judge and contestant at the National Pie Championships.











The Florida Keys are full of history in any avenue you journey. The performing arts are no different. Its roots are buried deep in the history of Key West and the Florida Keys! One theme is common: finding the right home for our local performing arts groups!

RED BARN THEATER & WATERFRONT PLAYHOUSE: A SHARED HISTORY OF THE KEY WEST PLAYERS

The Key West Players came to life in 1940 when a group of naval officers and civilians conceived the idea. One month later, its first production was performed on the Harris School stage. For the next four years, The Key West Players performed in various locations, including aboard the U.S.S. Howard W. Gilmore, a submarine tender stationed in Key West.

The Players found its first permanent home at the Red Barn Theater in 1944. Originally built as a carriage house in 1829, the automobile made it obsolete, and the "barn" was adopted. The troupe continued to perform there over the next seventeen years, growing from its original twenty members to several hundred by the early 1960's.

In 1960, with the help of Tennessee Williams, The Players decided to convert a crumbling ice warehouse built in the 1880's into a theater. It is now its permanent home. Located in historic Mallory Square, the warehouse was transformed into The Waterfront Playhouse--its first production in November 1961.

Today, The Waterfront Playhouse brings together local talent and seasoned professionals from New York. It cultivates new performers through its youth program and provides an environment for everyone to learn from each other. Isn't that what theater is all about!

The Waterfront Playhouse has made its productions accessible to both locals and tourists with classics such as Arsenic and Old Lace, Broadway productions that include Kinky Boots, and cult favorites like The Rocky Horror Show. The Waterfront Playhouse continues to evolve with the ever-changing cultural community of Key West.

Meanwhile, back at the barn...the Red Barn's theatrical ambitions revived in the 1960's by Ruth Guttman and her husband Yehuda. They presented wonderful puppet shows in the 1970s, as well as piano concerts by Yehuda.

A transformation began in 1980 when a group of actors and technicians renovated the theater and incorporated it under the name of the Red Barn Actors Studio, Inc. Their mission was to bring professional theater to Key West. With the support of well-known artists like Tennessee Williams, Shel Silverstein, Richard Wilbur, and others, combined with their love and enthusiasm, they provided Key West with another theatrical venue that welcomes both local and internationally proclaimed talent.

The Red Barn provides audiences with a variety of productions that are often relevant and timely. Quarantine for Two, written by local playwright Hy Conrad, made its world premiere at the Red Barn in 2022. It made the awful COVID quarantine into something all could laugh at. It does not limit itself to just plays and musicals. It has opened its doors to musicians like Vail Johnson and musical performance themed events like Conchs, Cowboys, and Tales of Old Key West.

The variety of productions is what keeps Red Barn alive and a welcome addition to the performing arts of Key West and the Florida Keys!

MARATHON COMMUNITY THEATER

The Marathon Community Theater began in 1944 as a traveling troupe called the Marathon Little Theatre. For over 50 years its productions were held at locations throughout the community. "Backstage" consisted of tents and travel trailers set up in parking lots where the actors could get into their makeup and costumes. In the early 1990's, the community came together and raised the funds needed to purchase a venue. The Marathon Community Theater is now housed in the former Plaza Lounge, The Side Door Lounge, and the Middle Keys only movie theatre--The Marathon Cinema.

It is committed to providing quality performing arts experiences that reflect the community's values. Besides four main-stage theatrical productions each season, there are intimate gallery readings, public art shows, concerts, community dance showcases, a variety show fundraiser, a children's summer theater program with productions like Seussical Jr., and multiple special events like Drag Queen Bingo! The Marathon Community Theater continues to build the Middle Keys' cultural offerings to locals and visitors alike.

Born and raised in Key West, Julie (Moore) Cuneo's family planted its roots in the Keys when her great-great grandfather settled here from Portugal. He was a Seminole Indians trader. His son was born here and began the Conch legacy she is so proud of.

Her family's experiences inspired her interest in local history. As a child, her great grandfather was kidnapped. A Seminole Indian Chief was connected to the rescue and punishment of the kidnapper.

Since then, she has turned his story into a 10-minute play for Fringe's Key West Characters. She also presented it as part of the annual Key West Cemetery Stroll.

THE KEYS PLAYERS—UPPER KEYS

In 1978, The Key Players was established in the Upper Keys. The troupe originally presented live theater, selecting established playwrights, and bringing musicals, comedies, and dramatic plays produced on Broadway, Off Broadway, and in Regional Theaters around the world. Today it provides opportunities for local playwrights to share their work, and helps local schools bring the performing arts to their students.

Today's Key Players are professionals that produce, direct, and act professionally. They continue to keep community theater alive and thriving in the Upper Keys with a variety of productions like Man of La

Mancha and The Great American Trailer-Park Musical, as well as local events.

The troupe continues to perform at venues around the Upper Keys, primarily at the Murray E. Nelson Government and Cultural Center. As a non-profit, the all-volunteer organization strives to bring joy to the community through live theater, world-class musicals, murder mysteries, and other performances.

FRINGE THEATER KEY WEST

"Expect the Unexpected". In 2009, some theater enthusiasts decided Key West needed a theater "of the people by the people". They called it The People's Theater of Key West and began the journey that led to today's Fringe Theater Key West.

Originally staging its productions in creative places like churches, museums, art galleries, and more—Fringe now boasts an innovative and immersive black box theater style. From original plays like local playwright Ben Harrison's El Ilano 1921; repeat favorites like Key West Characters that gives local talent the opportunity to write, direct and act in a local production; and off-Broadway plays and musicals, Fringe features local talent to bring its productions to life. Its home is now the historic Armory, an intimate, inclusive, and decidedly unexpected venue!

THE SOUTH FLORIDA SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA

It began in 1997 when Maestra Sebrina María Alfonso, a Key West native, founded the Key West Symphony Orchestra. Since then, it has expanded and now performs in Palm Beach, Broward, Miami-Dade, and Monroe Counties. Locally it performs at Key West's Tennessee Williams Fine Arts Center.

KEY WEST BURLESQUE

While performing in Key West for more than seventeen seasons and at numerous venues around town, for the last few years, Key West Theater has been home to the Key West Burlesque. Enjoy the bold and bodacious performances of classic striptease, cheeky parody shows, and vaudeville style entertainment.

And more!

Multiple venues provide locals and tourists with a variety of opportunities to enjoy the performing arts. Live music abounds across the island chain at local bars and restaurants. Venues such as The Tennessee Williams Fine Arts Theater, San Carlos Theater, LaTeDa Cabaret, Key West Theater, Coffee Butler Amphitheater, The Studios of Key West, and Ocean Reef Cultural Center host plays, musicals, cabaret performances, dance troupes, opera, symphony, and other types of performing arts from around the world.

The Keys are not just an archipelago we call home. This community's performing arts continues to evolve over the years and maintains a relevant presence throughout the Keys!
